## Update from Ecuador

Sent separately with this edition of the Extra you will find the latest newsletter from Sharon Wilcox in Ecuador.

The situation in Ecuador continues to deteriorate, with the homicide rate now the highest in South America, mainly due to gang warfare between drug cartels. Early results of a referendum to try to get more powers for the prime minister and government to fund more security measures have been in favour of these proposals, but the full results are still awaited.

As well as a curfew, there are regular power blackouts owing to neighbouring Bolivia, which exports power to Ecuador, having had insufficient rain to generate enough hydro-electric power. All this means that Sharon is unable to travel between her project groups very much, and of course electronic communication is hampered by the power cuts.

A reduction in aid funding from our own government has contributed to a reduction in vaccination development for Dengue fever, cases of which are increasing owing to changes in climate.

Please continue to pray for:

- the government to be able to establish the rule of law and that the power of the drug gangs will be diminished
- that the youngsters and volunteers will still be able to continue with activities, and that parents will not stop them because of concerns regarding safety
- for greater rainfall so that all can have access to clean water and hydro-electric plants have sufficient water to produce electricity
- that a Dengue Fever vaccination will be found and made available
- for Sharon's safety and that of her Link Aid colleague.
